TWISTED, INLAID STEM, THIN GOBLETS

Dennis Liggett demonstrated how to turn a goblet last month. He passed a round examples of his subject. We all liked the double inlay stem. Dennis started off by showing how to make the twisted stem. He learned this technique from Stuart Mortimer and has improved upon it by using a gun boring bit with compressed air blowing and cooling the tip. cooling is the key. Without the air and gun barrel bit the Stuart used a pot of water to cool the bit to keep it going straight thru the center of the blank. this is of course important when using exotic material. Next Dennis turned a thin dowel which will fit into the hole drilled. He used a skew and his left hand to steady the thinness. He used lots of super glue to glue the dowel into the stem blank.

Dennis cut the tenon on each end of the blank and then laid out the spiral. basically he drew a graph paper grid around the stem and then connected intersections to create the line to cut the spirals. Any questions, please call Dennis. Using files he roughed out the lines down to the contrasting wood and viola, and real neat stem.

Next he cut the goblet and base from the same type of wood and mounted them to the stem. Of course mere words can not describe the accumulated skill required to execute these items. It was a well done and enjoyed demonstration, Thank you Dennis.



The meeting was called to order by President Ed Davidson at 4:30 PM October 5, 2006. Board members present were Tony Bevis, Larry Fox, Kay Caunt, Doug Ament , John Tulloch and Jim Carey.

Dick Breckon was not present and Ed Davidson reported that the club had about \$ 1500 in the account and after 2007 dues were collected we would have close to \$2500 - \$ 3000.

Ed reported the PPW club had purchased a Jet Mini lathe for the Zeb Pike Juvenile detention center for their youth pen making program. This donation was made with the proceeds of walnut log sale. This was approved by the board.

The rebates from the Wood Craft receipt program was going to be between \$ 200 and \$400 depending upon final adjustments. It was decided by the board to use the proceeds to buy \$50 gift certificates from Wood Craft and put one in our monthly raffle starting in November 2006

John Tulloch decided to step down as program director so the board enlisted Tony Bevis to take his place and then enlisted Kay Caunt to take over Tony's job of editor of the club newsletter, Subject to approval of the membership.

The club 2007 program budget was set at \$1500 the same as for 2006.

The 2007 club library was set at \$200 the same as 2006 plus any funds not spent in 2006.

It was decided to form a three member committee to write a grant for AAW to purchase a new video and audio system for the club.

The board voted to add a swap meet and/or sale to the 2007 shop tours.

It was pointed out that for our AAW liability insurance to be in force all club board members (not club members) must be members of AAW. Since at the present time they are all members of AAW the discussion on how to guarantee that new board members would be AAW members was tabled until a later date.

The shop tours this year were a success (Snow and all) but the board decided to improve them for next year by adding a swap meet and/or sale of wood, turning tools, etc. to each of the tours.
