Larry Fox counted our Art Show with BAC to be a big success. He was impressed with amount of member participation. There was a huge number of compliments from visitors to

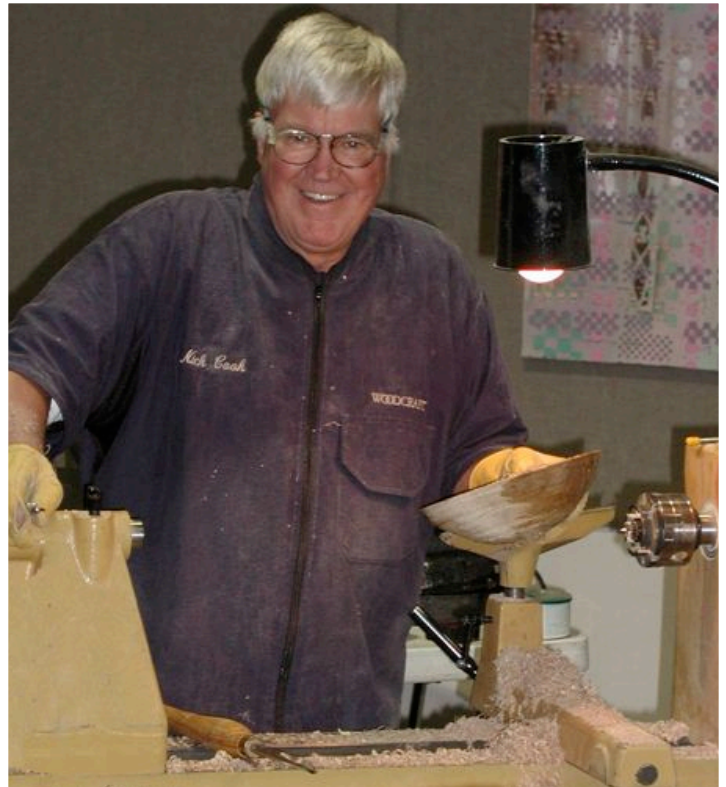
the gallery on the quality and creativeness of the exhibit. Unfortunately, there were no sales. This is probably a result of the economy. Art is one of the first things to suffer.

anything requested by a customer. He has even chained two Powermatic lathes together to mount a big log between the two headstocks to turn solid bar stools.
