The Saturday Demonstration will begin at 9 a.m., in the Club's regular meeting area. \$20 covers the cost of the facility, as well as lunch provided by the club.

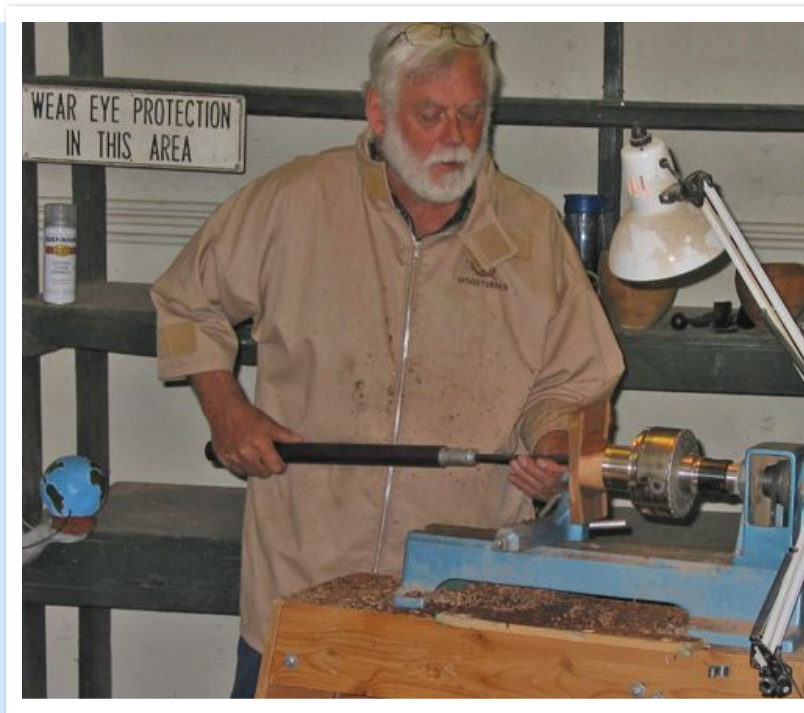
OUR FIRST CLUB

JULY DEMO:

Scott Longberry's beaded bowl was sitting in the gallery for the Club Show as he took on the job of demonstrating this tricky maneuver for all of us at the July meeting.

Scott began with a description of the variety of beads available for use in turnings. He generally prefers hematite, which is neutral and shiny, or lamp-worked beads from specialty suppliers. Choose



the beads before you turn the bowl!

It is important to remember that inserting the beads will change the profile of the finished bowl. When you choose the place to part off the rim, find a place where the wire holding the bead will be vertical. Before cutting the rim, lay out the placement lines for the beads. The pencil is a tool, too...

Scott uses 18 g copper wire, plated black. He parts off the rim, and then drills the

holes with a small pin vise. He glues the wires into the bowl, adds the beads, lines up the grain,

sets the rim on top. He then carefully inverts the whole assembly and lines up the wires with the holes.

Thanks, Scott, for a thorough demonstration of the key steps in this elegant technique.

NOTES FROM THE ALBUQUERQUE SYMPOSIUM by Papa Joe Aquila

I go to these various Symposiums for a variety of reasons: 1) to quench my thirst for knowledge, 2) to visit the trade show and Instant Gallery, 3) Camaraderie, and 4) avoid seeing past demonstrators.

I attended rotations by Emmet Kane from Ireland, Marilyn Campbell, Rolly

Munro, Andrew Chen, Chris Pytlik, Pascal Oulet, and Molly Winton--all of whom I had not seen before. I didn't buy Rolly Munro's tool, however much it might improve my deep hollowing! I was particularly impressed with Chris Pytlik's use of dyes and gloss finishes. He doesn't teach from his shop, but he would be a good demonstrator for our club.

I broke my own rule, and attended Mike Mahoney's demonstration on turning burial urns with threaded lids. Although I have seen Mike at Provo over the years, he is an absolute delight to watch, and he makes the type of useful things that I enjoy making. The same can be said about Nick Cook's demonstration of pepper mills.

The Instant Gallery, as usual, displayed many different and interesting turnings.

As for camaraderie, I met some old club members from the Bay Area--Merryll Saylan, internationally know Jon Sauer and a budding turner, Glenn Krueg. It was fun to find other PPW members at the

symposium. Years ago, I demonstrated lace bobbins with some help from a lady who walked me through lace bobbin making via the internet. At the last rotation, I found her sitting next to me, and I was thoroughly surprised to finally meet her.

The Albuquerque Convention Center was well set up and there was adequate seating for all of the demonstrations.

My trip home was a nice sunny day with pillows of fluffy white clouds dotting a sky of blue. I hope the members who were unable to attend will some day be able to take one of the Symposiums.
