possible without cutting through the thinnest part of the wall. The mallee is a hardwood which does not produce shavings, so it requires a sharp tool and a correspondingly light touch.

The natural edge bowl from bristlecone pine (top photo) is another one of Elmer's top sellers. He usually saturates the cambium layer of the wood--between

classy shavings.....

Elmer "Jake" Jacobs brought in some of his specialty wood to demonstrate what he has learned about making some of those tricky cuts.

He showed us his style of cutting a red mallee burl (*photo-right*) into a bowl which keeps the burl texture on the outside. The challenge with this wood is to find the largest bowl



the chunky bark and the sapwood--with CA glue to assure that it stays on.

The follow-up to this demo was an invitation to view Elmer's demonstration at the gallery which represents him in Old Colorado City. It was a unique view at the steps between the chainsaw and the collector!
