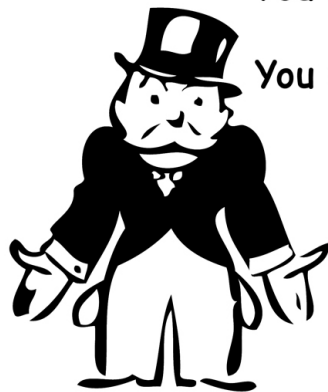

MARCH DEMONSTRATION

Milo Scott will show us how to work with the new ceramic technology for peppermills.

He has investigated two different ceramic mechanisms from different suppliers, the instructions provided, and the special tools needed to get a precise fit.

If you plan to make these mills for pepper or other spices, don't miss this demonstration. It will save your time and some nice wood. You can always figure it out for yourself, or with help from Chris West via his article in American Woodturner--available online to AAW members.

February Demonstration:

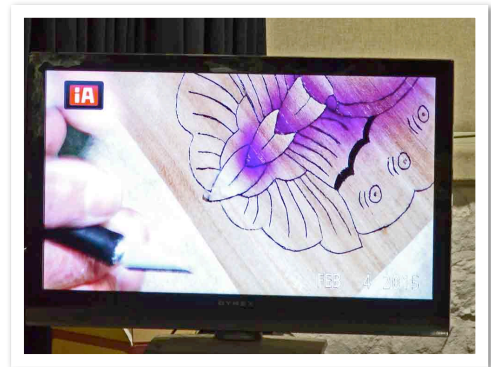
Robert Brewer shared his joyful way of working with airbrush colors in the February demonstration.

In addition to the technical information in the handout, his method of cleaning the airbrush was a

great demo all by itself--an efficient system for clearing the color into an old milk jug with care and patience.



Our camera system was very important to grasp the detail in this demonstration.

One key to successful airbrushing is the use of a frisket, or mask to collect the overspray. Robert used an adhesive film, which he peeled away as soon as he finished an area in the design.
