PRESIDENTS MESSAGE


Yowza, yowza! It's been a great month. Started off the month on the 2nd with my 60th Birthday. Yeah I made it this far.

JULY PPW INTERACTIVE MEETING

Try a new Finishing Technique!

For this meeting, you need to bring one or more turnings that have been sanded, but not finished. We will have a variety of things to try out:

- Beall system wax/buff finish (Tony)
- Bleaching with Dr. Bob and Juergen's new method (Dr. Bob)
- Milk Paint (Kay)
- Food-safe finishes (the ones Dennis uses in the Bemis class)
- Sanding sealer as a finish with Renaissance wax (Foxy)
- Antique/crackle finish with Wayne
- C/A finish for small turnings (Vic)

If you are worried that you might not like the finish, leave the tenon on the piece and you can sand or turn it off when you go home!

We will also have Mark Harry there to help with sanding techniques to eliminate scratches
