

May Demonstration: Birdhouse Ornaments with Dennis

Do you ever wonder where these ideas come from? Dennis first learned about the miniature birdhouse ornaments from Bob Rosand, who made one because he didn't have big enough wood for a real birdhouse.

In the early 90's, there were a lot of mini lathes, and Bob taught folks to make the ornaments. Right after that, Dale Nish started making a new style every year for his family members. Dale taught the ornaments at the Utah Symposium, and sold kits through Craft Supplies.

Dennis liked the challenge of developing a new style every year, and he is now well into his second decade of ornament building. To work in a series, he sticks with consistent dimensions, and then assembles several ornaments at a time.



For our club, Dennis will show a variety of styles, turn one or two, and reveal the many keys to success that he has discovered in the production of hundreds of birdhouses.

At the 2016 Bemis holiday art sale, the club sold over \$900 in ornaments from our inventory, so it is time to stock up! Dennis will provide some helpful guidelines to get everyone started. The wonderful thing about this project is that you will be able to use branch wood and little bits of scrap that you have saved. It is also a wonderful project for using Colorado Aspen, which turns easily in the spindle-wise direction, sands like a dream, and makes a poor landscaping tree.

Selling Christmas Ornaments

One of the other things that Bob Rosand figured out twenty-five years ago, was that the birdhouse ornaments are too labor-intense to wholesale to galleries. We ran into this problem with the gallery at the Fine Arts Center last year. If the turner needs to make \$35 per ornament, the retail gallery price would be \$70. That is well over the public's expectation of what they should cost. Generally, \$45-50 is the ceiling at which you can sell ornaments. We sold the donated Club ornaments between \$20 and \$45. At \$25 or \$30, people will buy more than one. If you use precious wood, or make a masterpiece, keep that one for yourself, or for a gift.

Around the Club

PREVIEW: JUNE Interactive meeting

Robert and Kay will bring some marbling supplies to the June meeting so that folks can dip their own turnings into a vortex of color. Because many of us will be using the colors, they will come out with random swirls instead of regular patterns.

We will use dishpan-size tubs, or smaller, so please make a small piece for this event. **DO NOT APPLY ANY FINISH OR SANDING SEALER.** Lighter colors of wood show off the color better than darker woods. When you arrive, we will coat your turning with an alum solution and dry it before you can dip into the colors. You may also want to bring some latex gloves for this experience. The alum is a strong alkali that dries out your skin.

Some things to turn: Shallow Bowls under 5 inches in diameter, turned pen sections (unassembled), small box, small fruit shapes, spinning tops, Christmas ornament, or any other small turning that you like to make.

We will be using various acrylic paints. When you get back in your shop, you may want to seal the colors with an acrylic lacquer. If you leave your tenon on the piece for dipping, you can remount the piece and sand off the marbling if you don't like the results.
